

'Bubble Bath' allium Allium hybrid

Summer-blooming, clump-forming 'Bubble Bath' allium is bound to be an even bigger hit than its classic cousin 'Millenium'. Yes, it's just as easy to care for and has lots of flowers that pollinators love. But these blooms are significantly bigger — 3 inches in diameter — making it a real showstopper!

### 1 'Jewel' coreopsis Coreopsis hybrid

This new coreopsis cultivar is covered with delicately painted blooms - a clear vellow center fades to white with a vibrant lilac edge. It works well with lots of different flower colors in the border. And its threadleaf foliage has excellent disease resistance.

'Coral Red' hen and chicks Sempervivum hybrid Whether you grow hen and chicks as a ground cover or container accent, these vibrant red (redder than most!) rosettes will turn heads. One "hen" can grow up to 6 Inches across, and plants keep this color year-round when you grow them in full sun.

6 'Red Lark' delphinium Delphinium x hybrida This new delphinium grows the classic spike filled with Individual flowers. But they're coral-red instead of the typical blue, purple or white palette. The blooms are sterile, which means there's no pausing to form seed

and you get plenty of stems for bouquets.

### Minibeckia™ Flame rudbeckia Rudbeckia hybrid

Easy-care plants produce loads of these big 4- to 6-inch semidouble blooms from summer to frost. Go ahead and cut as many stems for bouquets as you'd like because it encourages more flowers to form.

6 'Dark Side of the Moon' astilbe Astilbe hybrid This gorgeous astilbe is full of surprises. The foliage is a deep chocolate brown and it flowers best in full sun, producing loads of purple blooms. Just be sure to water regularly to prevent crispy leaves.

## 'Copper King' heucherella Heucherella hybrid

Add warmth to your shade garden with the 5-inch-wide coppery red leaves of this pretty heucherella. Newer growth has a yellow edge for a multicolored look earlier in the season. Small white flowers show up in spring. Cut the spent stems off below the foliage to tidy things up.

### 4 'Voices in the Wind' hosta Hosta hybrid

This new hosta with creamy yellow-edged leaves stands out from the rest, adding movement and texture with its heavily ruffled edge. Lavender flowers attract humming-birds in mid- to late summer.

### 6 'Raspberry Frost' pulmonaria Pulmonaria hybrid

Silver spots and a distinctive creamy edge make this new pulmonaria one you won't want to miss out on. Strawberry-red blooms arrive in early spring before the foliage emerges.

### Golden Feathers' Jacob's ladder Polemonium pulcherrimum

'Golden Feathers' may be small, but its bright and bold foliage will bring some bling to your shade garden. In late spring to early summer you get the added bonus of dainty blue-purple flowers. Grow it at the front of the border to draw visitors over for a closer look.

### Lucky Devil™ ninebark Physocarpus opulifolius

Instead of the usual green or burgundy foliage, Lucky Devil has golden yellow leaves. They hold their color better from spring to late summer than some other varieties, then change to orange in fall. White spring flowers add interest, and bees love them.

### Pink Bijou<sup>™</sup> crape myrtle Lagerstroemia indica

Part of the Emerald Empire\* series, Pink Bijou has the same gorgeous green foliage but is smaller than others in the group — Just 5 feet tall and up to 6 feet wide. So even if you have a small garden, you can enjoy the bright pink spring blooms of crape myrtle.

### Vinho Verde™ welgela Welgela florida


This new weigela is grown more for its striking follage than its light crop of red-pink blooms in spring. Occasionally a stem will revert to all black, but it's not likely to take over. You can cut it off near the base to preserve a uniform look.

### Banana Split® daphne Daphne odora

With variegated foliage like this, Banana Split will be quite the statement plant even in part shade. Grow it next to an entry or along a path where you can get an up-close look at the leaves and enjoy the fragrant pink spring blooms.

# Boxwood Blight Solutions

If you've been waiting to plant more boxwoods because you're concerned about blight, here are a couple of options.



### Heritage<sup>™</sup> boxwood Buxus hybrid

The Better Boxwood series is super disease resistant so you can grow it even in areas with boxwood blight. Heritage has an upright habit but others in the group are lower growing or larger so there's something for everyone.

### Copper Glow box honeysuckle Lonicera nitida

For a boxwood substitute, try Copper Glow box honeysuckle. It's evergreen, has a naturally rounded shape (no pruning needed) and the glossy green leaves have coppery red new growth as you can see in the photo.

• XXL 'Grand Prismatic' dahlia Dahlia hybrid When you want drama in a container or near the front of the border, the big, 5-inch flowers of XXL 'Grand Prismatic' are a great choice. Plants have a tidy habit that doesn't usually need staking.

### Mega Pazzaz™ Pink Twist purslane Portulaca oleracea

You can't miss the vibrant blooms on this new addition to the Mega Pazzaz series — they practically pulsate! Pink Twist is super heat- and drought-tolerant and looks great in the ground or trailing over the edge of a pot.

A reintroduction of an heirloom variety, 'incredible! Sea Shells' is an annual coreopsis. Its 1½- to 2-inch blooms have fluted petals and come in a mix of colors with swishes and splashes. Use it to edge your cottage garden and fill containers — you'll have plenty of stems for summer bouquets.

Butterflies love lantana. And when we grew this new variety in the Luscious series, there were plenty of them visiting these blooms! Plants produce little to no seeds, which helped the plants we grew bloom nonstop, providing reliable color for the containers in our test garden.

Enjoy the rich chocolate-brown, silver-spotted and crinkly edged leaves of Ninetta begonia Inside or out. Give it part shade in the garden and a bright sunny room indoors. It has soft pink flowers in summer to fall.

Key Lime is from the Upside series of sweet potato vines that climb. You could let it trail over the edge of a pot, but Key Lime has tendrils that help it grow up a structure. We grew it on an obelisk at our test garden last summer and enjoyed the long-lasting foliage color, texture and height.

Whether you want a houseplant or a gorgeous spiller at the front of your patio containers (or both!), Pistachio White is your plant. It has broad white stripes and vigorous growth — not always the case with variegated plants.

Get loads of drama in your backyard with 'Waikiki', a new clump-forming colocasia in the Royal Hawaiian series. The eye-popping splash of color can be variable but gets more pronounced as the plant matures.

### Peppers from Heaven pepper Capsicum annuum

When you don't have a lot of room, these sweet peppers are a great choice. Each compact plant produces a single color of either red, yellow or orange peppers. We got loads of fruit from the plants we grew — they were almost too pretty to pick!

### Sapphire Cascade™ blueberry Vaccinium hybrid

Just like the name implies, Sapphire Cascade blueberry will trail over the edge of a container. You can even grow it in a hanging basket! Place it where you can grab a handful of the classic sweet berries and enjoy the red that colors the foliage in fall.

### Petite Pickles French cornichon Cucumis anguria

Though not true cucumbers, French cornichons are similar with smaller leaves and vines. This variety is early and vigorous, with lots of fruit. Harvest them small, at just a few inches long, for easy pickling.

### Preakness watermelon Citrullus hybrid

At 4 to 6 pounds, these adorable little watermelons won't take up much room in the refrigerator and they have plenty of flavor and no seeds! To ensure that the flowers are pollinated, grow it with another watermelon variety that flowers around the same time, such as Ace Plus (which has seeds). The nice thing about this companion is that the fruit is lighter green so it's easy to tell the two watermelons apart.
